WE ARE BACK and welcome to Season 35's opening production of the hilarious and irreverent off Broadway musical hit *Disenchanted!* 

The show had its first workshop in 2009 at Pearl Studios in NYC, over 700 women auditioned for 11 roles in this 1-night-only event, which after rave reviews and a standing "O" the run was extended. In 2012, it had its first Off-Broadway

reading at the Peter Jay Sharp Theatre at Playwrights Horizons.

'DIS!' - as the show is affectionately known for short - opened in a limited-engagement run Off-Broadway at the Theatre at St. Clement's in December of 2014 and then transferred to an open-ended run at the Westside Theatre in 2015. The production played to sold out houses, rave reviews, and several NYC award nominations including 'Outstanding Off-Broadway Musical' (Outer Critics Circle Awards), 'Best New Off-Broadway Musical' (Off Broadway Alliance Awards), and two Lucille Lortel Awards nominations ('Best Lead Actress' and 'Best Featured Actress'). 'DIS!' also received a nod from Playbill, making the list of 'Best of the Year - 2014' as well as an American Theatre Wing Henry Hewes Design Award nomination for 'Best Costumes.'

Mr. Reynolds received his B.F.A. in Theatrical Design from Florida Atlantic University and pursued graduate studies at Carnegie Mellon University. He served as Adjunct Professor/Guest Scenic Designer at Florida Southern College and Southeastern University and as Resident Designer of LCT and TWH. Mr. Reynolds' numerous directing credits include, Tommy, Shrek, The Bridges of Madison County, Mary Poppins, Rock of Ages, Mel Brooks' Young Frankenstein, Sweeney Todd, Les Mis, The Addams Family, Spamalot, Aida, You Can't Take it with You, A Christmas Story, The Last Night of Ballyhoo, Chicago, Macbeth, Godspell, Always...Patsy Cline, The Producers, Of Mice and Men, The Man Who Came to Dinner, I Hate Hamlet, Sanders Family Christmas, Moonlight and Magnolias, Swing! and The Last Five Years.
